Secondly, you should recall that there was a Royal Commission into our Aged Care system set up by the previous Government. A very full report was produced and both Federal Governments have been committed to making sure these recommendations happen. This will see a new Aged Care Act and therefore reforms. These reforms were to start on I July 2023. After the election the new Federal Government moved this target to I July 2024 but in the latest Budget this is now I July 2025. However, some changes have started such as our funding model, wage increases for various groups within Aged Care and some regulations. The new programme will be called In-Home Care and once there is more to talk about I shall let you know. If you are keen on the process you could look up the Department of Health and Aged Care website and see the various discussion papers. In the meantime, we shall continue what we are doing and hope you remain happy with our services.
